1 AN ACT concerning

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Vehicle Laws – Driver's Licenses Confiscated for Real ID Compliance – Failure to Possess or Display <u>Issuance and Display of Recall Notice</u>

- 4 FOR the purpose of establishing an exception to certain requirements that an individual possess or display a driver's license under certain circumstances if the individual's 5 6 license has been confiscated by a law enforcement officer within a certain amount of 7 time for failure to submit certain documents to the Motor Vehicle Administration 8 authorizing certain individuals to satisfy the requirement to possess and display a 9 driver's license while driving a motor vehicle by carrying and displaying a certain 10 recall notice issued under this Act for a certain period of time; requiring a law enforcement officer who confiscates an individual's driver's license for failure to 11 submit certain documents to provide the holder of the license a certain recall notice 12 that includes certain information; requiring the Motor Vehicle Administration to 13 develop a form for the recall notice and to provide the form to law enforcement 14 15 agencies; making this Act an emergency measure; providing for the termination of 16 this Act; and generally relating to requirements to possess or display a driver's 17 license.

6 7	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLANI That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

10	(a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.
11	(2) "Credential holder" has the meaning stated in § 16–1001 of this title.
12 13	(3) "Display" means the manual surrender of the licensee's license into the hands of the demanding officer for inspection.
14	(4) "Electronic credential" has the meaning stated in § 16–1001 of this title
15 16 17	(b) [Each] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (D) OF THE SECTION, EACH individual driving a motor vehicle on any highway in this State shall have his license with him.
18 19 20	(c) (1) [Each] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (D) OF THIS SECTION, EACH individual driving a motor vehicle on any highway in this State shadisplay the license to any uniformed police officer who demands it.

(E) Each individual driving a motor vehicle on any highway in this State shall, if requested by the officer, sign his usual signature in the presence of the officer so that the officer may determine whether he is the licensee.

1 A person may not give the name of another person or give a false or 2 fictitious name to any uniformed police officer who is attempting to determine the identity 3 of a driver of a motor vehicle.

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- 5 IF A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER CONFISCATES AN INDIVIDUAL'S (A) 6 DRIVER'S LICENSE FOR FAILURE TO SUBMIT THE DOCUMENTS REQUIRED UNDER § 7 16-106 OF THIS SUBTITLE, THE OFFICER SHALL ISSUE TO THE INDIVIDUAL A 8 WRITTEN RECALL NOTICE THAT INCLUDES:
- 9 **(1)** THE REASON FOR THE CONFISCATION OF THE LICENSE;
- 10 **(2)** A STATEMENT THAT THE INDIVIDUAL'S DRIVING PRIVILEGES 11 HAVE NOT BEEN REVOKED AS A RESULT OF THE CONFISCATION;
- 12 **(3)** INSTRUCTIONS ON HOW THE INDIVIDUAL MAY SUBMIT THE 13 REQUIRED DOCUMENTS TO RECEIVE A VALID DRIVER'S LICENSE; AND
- **(4)** 14 THE DATE OF THE ISSUANCE OF THE RECALL NOTICE.
- THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL: 15 (B)
- 16 **(1)** DEVELOP A FORM FOR THE RECALL NOTICE REQUIRED BY THIS 17 SECTION; AND
- 18 **(2)** MAKE THE FORM AVAILABLE TO ALL LAW ENFORCEMENT 19 AGENCIES IN THE STATE.

20 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has 22been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to 23each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is 24enacted. It shall remain effective through December 31, 2024, and, at the end of December 2531, 2024, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be 26 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
