4 (b) (1) A caregiver, a parent, or other person who has permanent or temporary 5 care or responsibility for the supervision of a vulnerable adult may not:

16 (d) A sentence imposed under this section shall be in addition to any other 17 sentence imposed for a conviction arising from the same facts and circumstances unless the 18 evidence required to prove each crime is substantially identical.

19 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 20 October 1, 2020.
