## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

### Election Law – Campaign Finance Violations – Injunctive Relief

FOR the purpose of authorizing the chairman or vice chairman of the State Board of
Elections to seek injunctive relief against a violation of the campaign finance laws;
repealing the authority of the Secretary of State to seek an immediate injunction
against a violation of the campaign finance laws; authorizing a candidate to seek
injunctive relief against certain violations of the campaign finance laws by certain
persons; providing for a delayed effective date; and generally relating to injunctive
relief against violations of the campaign finance laws.

#### HOUSE BILL 41

1(1) ANY PERSON REQUIRED TO FILE AN INDEPENDENT EXPENDITURE2REPORT UNDER § 13–306 OF THIS TITLE IF A PUBLIC COMMUNICATION RELATES TO3THE CANDIDATE; OR

4 (2) ANY PERSON REQUIRED TO FILE AN ELECTIONEERING 5 COMMUNICATION REPORT UNDER § 13–307 OF THIS TITLE IF AN ELECTIONEERING 6 COMMUNICATION RELATES TO THE CANDIDATE.

- 7 [(b)] (C) A person who violates an injunction issued under this section:
- 8 (1) is in criminal contempt; and

9 (2) is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to a fine not 10 exceeding \$250 or imprisonment not exceeding 30 days or both.

11 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 12 January 1, 2021.
