BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments, Article – Transportation Section 21–202(h) and, 21–202.1(a)(1) and (5), (c), and (d)(1) and (2), 21–801.1(a) and (b), and 21–809(a)(8) and (c)(1) and (2) Annotated Code of Maryland (2012 Replacement Volume and 2019 Supplement) BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Transportation Section 21–202.1(h) and 21–809(g) Annotated Code of Maryland (2012 Replacement Volume and 2019 Supplement)

- 1 "Traffic control signal monitoring system" means a device with one or (5)2 more motor vehicle sensors working in conjunction with a traffic control signal to produce 3 recorded images of motor vehicles entering an intersection against a red signal indication. 4 This section applies to a violation of § 21–202(h) of this subtitle at an 5 intersection monitored by a traffic control signal monitoring system. 6 (d) (1) Unless the driver of the motor vehicle received a citation from a police 7 officer at the time of the violation, the owner or, in accordance with subsection (g)(5) of this 8 section, the driver of a motor vehicle is subject to a civil penalty if the motor vehicle is 9 recorded by a traffic control signal monitoring system while being operated in violation of § 21–202(h) of this subtitle. 10 11 A civil penalty under this subsection may not exceed \$100. (2)12 If the civil penalty is not paid and the violation is not contested, the 13 Administration may refuse to register or reregister for may suspend the registration of 14 the motor vehicle. 15 21-801.1. 16 Unless there is a special danger that requires a lower speed to comply with § (a) 17 21-801 of this subtitle, the limits specified in this section or otherwise established under 18 this subtitle are maximum lawful speeds. A person may not drive a vehicle on a highway 19 at a speed that exceeds these limits. 20 (b) Except as otherwise provided in this section, the maximum speed limits are: 15 miles per hour in alleys in Baltimore County; 21(1) 22 **(2)** 30 miles per hour on: All highways in a business district; and 23 (i) Undivided highways in a residential district; 24(ii) 35 miles per hour on divided highways in a residential district; 25(3) 26 **(4)** 50 miles per hour on undivided highways in other locations; and 27 55 miles per hour on divided highways in other locations.
