1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Maryland Agricultural Commission – Hemp Industry Member**

3 FOR the purpose of altering the membership of the Maryland Agricultural Commission by
4 requiring the Governor to appoint a member from a list of a certain number of
5 nominees representing the hemp industry; and generally relating to the Maryland
6 Agricultural Commission.

7 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
8 Article – Agriculture
9 Section 2–203(a)
10 Annotated Code of Maryland
11 (2016 Replacement Volume and 2019 Supplement)

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
13 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Article – Agriculture**

15 2–203.

16 (a) The Commission has [30] **31** members. One member is ex officio and is the
17 principal administrative official for agricultural affairs at the University System of
18 Maryland as designated by the Chancellor of the University. The Governor appoints the
19 remaining [29] **30** members as follows:

- 21 (12) Two without nomination appointed at large from services related to
22 agriculture;
- 23 (13) One from a list of at least two nominees representing the turf industry;
- 24 (14) One from a list of at least two nominees representing the
25 horse-breeding industry;
- 26 (15) One from a list of at least two nominees representing the food
27 processing industry;
- 28 (16) One without nomination appointed at large from the general public to
29 be the consumer member;
- 30 (17) One from a list of at least two nominees representing the organic

2 (18) One from a list of at least two nominees representing direct farm
3 marketing;

4 (19) One from a list of at least two nominees representing viticulture;

5 (20) One from a list of at least two nominees representing agriculture
6 education in primary or secondary schools;

7 (21) One from a list of at least two nominees representing agri-business;

8 (22) One from a list of at least two nominees representing the forestry
9 industry;

10 (23) One from a list of at least two nominees representing the aquaculture
11 industry;

12 (24) One from a list of at least two nominees representing agri-tourism;
13 [and]

14 (25) One from a list of two nominees representing the biofuel industry; AND

15 (26) ONE FROM A LIST OF AT LEAST TWO NOMINEES REPRESENTING
16 THE HEMP INDUSTRY.

17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
18 October 1, 2020.
