A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Commission on African American Patriots in the American Revolutionary War

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Commission on African American Patriots in the 4 American Revolutionary War; providing for the composition, chair, staffing, and $\mathbf{5}$ office space of the Commission; providing for the compensation of the chair of the 6 Commission; providing that a member of the Commission is entitled to receive a 7 certain stipend under certain circumstances; requiring that the staff provided to the 8 Commission be adequately funded to perform certain duties; authorizing the 9 Commission to raise funds for its operation; requiring the Commission, in 10consultation with certain persons, to conduct research to advance the documentation 11 of African American patriots in the American Revolutionary War; requiring the 12Commission to determine and send to the county boards of education certain 13 information; requiring the Commission to use certain research in determining the 14information to be sent to the county boards of education under a certain provision of 15this Act and in developing a certain publication; requiring the Commission to develop 16and print a certain publication; requiring the Commission to assemble a certain 17inventory of sites; requiring the Commission to develop a plan to commemorate 18 Maryland African American patriots in the American Revolutionary War through the placement of statues, landmark plaques, or historical markers; requiring the 1920Commission to work with the Department of General Services to implement a certain 21plan; requiring that the collection in each public school library or media center 22include a certain publication on Maryland African American patriots in the 23American Revolutionary War; authorizing each county board of education to provide 24instruction on Maryland African American patriots in the American Revolutionary 25War as part of the social studies curriculum in primary and secondary public schools 26in the county; requiring a county board, under certain circumstances, to consider 27information sent by the Commission in developing its instruction on Maryland 28African American patriots in the American Revolutionary War; providing for the 29termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Commission on African 30 American Patriots in the American Revolutionary War.

17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 18 October 1, 2020. It shall remain effective for a period of 5 years and, at the end of September 19 30, 2025, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be 20 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
