- 1 **[**(f)**] (E)** For the purpose of determining weight, the Department may not 2 preclude the use of portable weigh scales.
- 3 [(g)] **(F)** A county shall revise its recycling plan by:
- 4 (1) October 1, 2010, to address the requirements of subsection (b)(10) of 5 this section;
- 6 (2) October 1, 2011, to address the requirements of subsection (b)(11) of 7 this section; and
- 8 (3) October 1, 2015, to address the requirements of subsection (b)(14) of 9 this section.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 11 October 1, 2020.
