2 Frederick County - Alcoholic Beverages - Cinema/Theater License

- 3 FOR the purpose of repealing certain time and area restrictions on the consumption of beer,
- wine, and liquor in a cinema or theater for which a certain license has been issued
- 5 in Frederick County; authorizing the on-premises consumption of beer, wine, and
- 6 liquor in the lobby or a screening room or performance hall in the licensed premises
- of the cinema or theater; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages in Frederick

- 19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 20 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 21 Article Alcoholic Beverages
- 22 20–102.
- 23 This title applies only in Frederick County.

- 1 (a) There is a Class CT (cinema/theater) (on-sale) beer, wine, and liquor license. 2 (b) The Board may issue the license for use in a for-profit cinema or theater that 3 has one or more screening rooms or performance halls. 4 The license authorizes the license holder to sell beer, wine, and liquor 5 for on-premises consumption by the can, bottle, or drink: 6 in a designated area of the lobby, for 45 minutes before a movie starts or a theater performance starts] IN THE LOBBY OR A SCREENING ROOM OR 7 8 PERFORMANCE HALL; and 9 to an individual who has a ticket to a movie or a theater (ii) performance and proper identification. 10 11 (2)A license holder shall offer for sale food other than candy and popcorn. 12 A customer may consume beer, wine, or liquor anywhere on the licensed (d) premises. 13 14 A license holder may exercise the privileges of the license Monday through (e) 15 Sunday. 16 (f) An individual serving beer, wine, or liquor: 17 (1) may not mix the contents of one bottle with the contents of another bottle: and 18 shall remove or destroy all empty bottles and cans. 19 (2) 20 A license holder shall: (g) (1) 21 obtain a crowd control training certificate from a program that is (i) 22certified by the State; and 23(ii) while selling beer, wine, and liquor, have one certified crowd 24control manager on the licensed premises for every 250 individuals present.
- 25 (2) Notwithstanding § 20–1903(a) of this title, a license holder shall require 26 one individual who has completed a certified alcohol awareness program to be on the 27 licensed premises at all times when alcohol is being served.
- 28 (h) The annual license fee is \$1,500.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 30 1, 2020.
