1 AN ACT concerning

Anne Arundel County – Alcoholic Beverages – Class B and Class H Licenses – Renewals

FOR the purpose of requiring a license holder, before each renewal of a Class B or Class H
alcoholic beverages license in Anne Arundel County, to attest in a sworn statement
that the gross receipts from food sales for a certain period of time immediately
preceding the application for renewal were equal to at least a certain percentage of
the gross receipts from the sale of food and alcoholic beverages sold for on-premises
<u>consumption</u>; and generally relating to the renewal of Class B and Class H alcoholic
beverages licenses in Anne Arundel County

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1 (2) is equipped with a public dining room with sufficient tables, chairs, 2 cutlery, and glassware to serve the meals prepared in the restaurant;

3 (3) is equipped with a kitchen that has complete facilities and utensils for 4 preparing and serving hot and cold meals to the public; and

5 (4) employs a sufficient number of cooks and wait staff to serve the number 6 of customers accommodated in the dining room.

7 (c) The license authorizes the license holder to sell beer, wine, and liquor at retail 8 at the place described in the license, for on– or off–premises consumption.

9 (d) **BEFORE EACH RENEWAL OF THE LICENSE, THE LICENSE HOLDER SHALL** 10 ATTEST IN A SWORN STATEMENT THAT THE GROSS RECEIPTS FROM FOOD SALES FOR 11 THE **12**-MONTH PERIOD IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING THE APPLICATION FOR 12 RENEWAL WERE AT LEAST EQUAL TO **51**% OF THE GROSS RECEIPTS FROM THE SALE 13 OF FOOD AND ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES <u>SOLD FOR ON-PREMISES CONSUMPTION</u>.

- 14 **(E)** The annual fee for the license is \$1,080.

16 (a) There is a Class H beer, wine, and liquor license.

17 (b) The license authorizes the license holder to sell beer, wine, and liquor at retail 18 at the place described in the license, for on-premises consumption.

19 (c) The license holder may sell beer, wine, and liquor during the hours and days 20 as set out under § 11–2004(e) of this title.

(d) BEFORE EACH RENEWAL OF THE LICENSE, THE LICENSE HOLDER SHALL
ATTEST IN A SWORN STATEMENT THAT THE GROSS RECEIPTS FROM FOOD SALES FOR
THE 12-MONTH PERIOD IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING THE APPLICATION FOR
RENEWAL WERE AT LEAST EQUAL TO 51% OF THE GROSS RECEIPTS FROM THE SALE
OF FOOD AND ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES.

26 **(E)** The annual license fee is \$960.
