A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Health Occupations - Social Workers - Scope of Practice, Supervision, and Application Decision Appeal Process

- 4 FOR the purpose of altering the definition of "practice social work" for the purposes of the $\mathbf{5}$ Maryland Social Workers Act to include counseling for alcohol and drug use and 6 addictive behaviors; providing that certain provisions of law may not be construed to 7 prohibit certain licensees from applying or qualifying to obtain approval by the State 8 Board of Social Work Examiners to engage in independent practice under certain 9 circumstances; requiring the Board, under certain circumstances, to approve certain licensees approved to engage in independent practice to provide supervision; 10 11 authorizing an applicant for a certain license to appeal the Board's rejection of an 12application to take a certain licensure examination by submitting certain 13 documentation to the Board in a certain manner; making conforming changes; and 14generally relating to the licensure and practice of social workers.
