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## Health Occupations – Social Workers – Scope of Practice, Supervision, and Application Decision Appeal Process

FOR the purpose of altering the definition of "practice social work" for the purposes of the 4 5 Maryland Social Workers Act to include counseling for alcohol and drug use and 6 addictive behaviors and to clarify that it includes, for certain individuals, the 7 treatment of biopsychosocial conditions under the supervision of a licensed social worker-clinical; providing that certain provisions of law may not be construed to 8 prohibit certain licensees from applying or qualifying to obtain approval by the State 9 10 Board of Social Work Examiners to engage in independent practice under certain 11 circumstances; requiring the Board, under certain circumstances, to approve certain 12 licensees approved to engage in independent practice to provide supervision; authorizing an applicant for a certain license to appeal the Board's rejection of an 13 application to take a certain licensure examination by submitting certain 14 documentation to the Board in a certain manner; making conforming changes; and 15 generally relating to the licensure and practice of social workers. 16


