1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Maryland Police Training and Standards Commission – Training Requirements**
3 **– Hate Crimes**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Police Training and Standards Commission to
5 require certain entrance–level and in–service police training conducted by the State
6 and each county and municipal police training school to include certain training
7 relating to the criminal laws concerning hate crimes; and generally relating to police
8 training requirements.

9 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
10 Article – Public Safety
11 Section 3–207(a)(6)
12 Annotated Code of Maryland
13 (2018 Replacement Volume and 2019 Supplement)

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
15 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 **Article – Public Safety**

17 3–207.

1 (a) The Commission has the following powers and duties:

2 (6) to require, for entrance-level police training and at least every 3 years
3 for in-service level police training conducted by the State and each county and municipal
4 police training school, that the curriculum and minimum courses of study include special
5 training, attention to, and study of the application and enforcement of:

6 (i) the criminal laws concerning rape and sexual offenses, including
7 the sexual abuse and exploitation of children and related evidentiary procedures;

8 (ii) the criminal laws concerning human trafficking, including
9 services and support available to victims and the rights and appropriate treatment of
10 victims;

11 **(III) THE CRIMINAL LAWS CONCERNING HATE CRIMES,**
12 **INCLUDING THE RECOGNITION OF, RESPONSE TO, AND REPORTING OF INCIDENTS**
13 **REQUIRED TO BE REPORTED UNDER § 2-307 OF THIS ARTICLE;**

14 ~~[(iii)]~~ **(IV)** the contact with and treatment of victims of crimes and
15 delinquent acts;

16 ~~[(iv)]~~ **(V)** the notices, services, support, and rights available to
17 victims and victims' representatives under State law; and

18 ~~[(v)]~~ **(VI)** the notification of victims of identity fraud and related
19 crimes of their rights under federal law;

20 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
21 October 1, 2020.
