- FOR the purpose of altering the time that a local board of elections may begin opening
  absentee ballot envelopes to canvass the absentee ballots cast in an election;
  prohibiting the use of a wireless wide area network to transmit data from certain
  electronic poll books to the State Board of Elections or the local boards of elections
  during an election that is held before a certain date; making this Act an emergency
  measure; and generally relating to the canvass of absentee ballots election
  administration.

6 7 8	(a) Following an election, each local board shall meet at its designated counting center to canvass the absentee ballots cast in that election in accordance with the regulations and guidelines established by the State Board.
9 10	(b) (1) A local board may not open any envelope of an absentee ballot [prior to 8] <b>BEFORE 9</b> a.m. on the [Wednesday] <b>FRIDAY</b> following election day.

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That a wireless wide area network or a Long Term Evolution cellular network may not be used to transmit data from the electronic poll books used in precinct polling places on Election Day to the State Board of Elections or the local boards of elections during an election that is held before January 1, 2021.
