- FOR the purpose of altering the definition of "practice athletic training"; requiring a licensed athletic trainer to practice athletic training in accordance with standards of practice established by certain organizations; repealing certain provisions of law requiring an athletic trainer to practice in a certain setting; altering the information that is required to be included in an evaluation and treatment protocol; repealing certain definitions; repealing certain obsolete provisions; making conforming changes; and generally relating to the Maryland Athletic Trainers Act.



 - (i) Within the scope of practice of an athletic trainer; and
- 19 (ii) Included in the evaluation and treatment protocol that the 20 athletic trainer has entered into with the supervising physician.
- 21 (e) In the event of a sudden departure, incapacity, or death of a supervising physician, a designated alternate supervising physician may assume the role of the supervising physician by submitting an evaluation and treatment protocol to the Board within 15 days of the event.
