  2 NOT CONTINGENT ON, any federal education benefits for which a recipient qualifies as a
  3 result of an individual's military service or status as a dependent of a member of the armed
  4 forces or of a veteran of the armed forces.
  - (e) (1) Each scholarship may be used, at any eligible institution, to pay for educational expenses as defined by the Office, including:
    - (i) Tuition and mandatory fees; and
- 8 (ii) Room and board.

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- 9 (2) The annual amount of a scholarship may not exceed 50% of the equivalent annual tuition, mandatory fees, and room and board of a resident undergraduate student OR A GRADUATE STUDENT at the 4-year public institution of higher education within the University System of Maryland, other than the University of Maryland Global Campus and University of Maryland, Baltimore Campus, with the highest annual expenses for a full-time resident undergraduate.
- 15 (f) A scholarship recipient shall maintain a grade point average of at least 2.5 on 16 a 4.0 scale.

- 1 Funds for the Veterans of the Afghanistan and Iraq Conflicts (k) (1) 2 Scholarship shall be as provided in the annual budget of the Commission by the Governor. 3 In this subsection, "Fund" means the Veterans of the Afghanistan and Iraq Conflicts Scholarship Fund. 4 5 There is a Veterans of the Afghanistan and Iraq Conflicts 6 Scholarship Fund in the Commission. 7 The Commission shall administer the Fund. (iii) 8 (iv) The Fund is a special, nonlapsing fund that is not subject to § 9 7–302 of the State Finance and Procurement Article. 10 The State Treasurer shall hold the Fund separately and the (v) Comptroller shall account for the Fund. 11 12 (vi) The Commission: 13 May accept any gift or grant from any person or 1. corporation for the Fund; 14 15 2. Shall use any gift or grant that it receives for a scholarship 16 from the Fund; and 17 3.
