#### 1 AN ACT concerning

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## Mobile Laundry for the Homeless Pilot Program – Established

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Mobile Laundry for the Homeless Pilot Program in the 4 Division of Neighborhood Revitalization; providing for the purpose of the Pilot  $\mathbf{5}$ Program; requiring the Division to administer the Pilot Program; requiring the 6 Division to award funds under the Pilot Program through certain grants to establish 7 certain mobile laundry services for the homeless; establishing certain eligibility 8 requirements; authorizing in-kind contributions to be used to meet a certain 9 requirement; requiring the Division to rate positively certain nonprofit organizations 10 in selecting applicants to which grants will be awarded; requiring the Division to establish a certain system of outcome measurement; requiring recipients of a grant 11 12under the Pilot Program to submit certain information to the Division; requiring the 13 Division to submit to the Department of Housing and Community Development certain information on or before a certain date; requiring the Department to evaluate 14the effectiveness of the Pilot Program and make a certain recommendation to the 1516 Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain date; defining certain 17terms; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Mobile 18 Laundry for the Homeless Pilot Program.

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(1) TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR A GRANT UNDER THE PILOT PROGRAM, A **(E)** NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION MUST: 3 **(I)** HAVE A MISSION THAT INCLUDES SERVICE TO THE 4 HOMELESS; AND SECURE CONTRIBUTIONS IN AN AMOUNT OF MONEY OR (II) OTHER CONSIDERATION AT LEAST EQUAL IN VALUE TO HALF THE AMOUNT OF FUNDING SOUGHT UNDER THE PILOT PROGRAM. (2) IN-KIND CONTRIBUTIONS MAY BE USED TO MEET THE **REQUIREMENT OF PARAGRAPH (1)(II) OF THIS SUBSECTION.** IN SELECTING APPLICANTS TO WHICH GRANTS WILL BE AWARDED (3) UNDER THE PILOT PROGRAM, THE DIVISION SHALL POSITIVELY RATE APPLICANTS THAT: 13 **(I)** DEMONSTRATE FISCAL CONTROLS, INCLUDING BY MAKING 14 **USE OF MULTIPLE SOURCES OF FUNDING;** 15**(II)** EXHIBIT PROJECT EFFECTIVENESS, INCLUDING BY SHOWING HOW A GRANT AWARDED UNDER THE PILOT PROGRAM WILL BE USED TO 16 17AUGMENT EXISTING SERVICES TO CREATE SEAMLESS SERVICES FOR THE 18 HOMELESS: 19 (III) SHOW PREVIOUS SUCCESSFUL **EXPERIENCE** 20**ADMINISTERING GRANTS; AND** (IV) MEET ANY OTHER CRITERIA THE DIVISION CONSIDERS 22**RELEVANT.** 23**(F)** (1) THE DIVISION SHALL ESTABLISH A SYSTEM OF OUTCOME 24MEASUREMENT TO ASSESS THE EFFECTIVENESS OF THE PILOT PROGRAM. 31(G) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 15, 2023, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL 32 EVALUATE THE EFFECTIVENESS OF THE PILOT PROGRAM AND MAKE A

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RECOMMENDATION TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1257 OF
 THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON WHETHER THE
 PILOT PROGRAM SHOULD CONTINUE TO OPERATE.

4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 5 October 1, 2020. It shall remain effective for a period of 4 years and, at the end of September 6 30, 2024, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be 7 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
