State and Local Procurement – Payment Practices

- 3 FOR the purpose of altering a State policy regarding the payment of certain funds after 4 receipt of a proper invoice; requiring each county and municipality to adopt a certain $\mathbf{5}$ policy; reducing the number of days following receipt of an invoice after which the 6 State owes interest on unpaid amounts and interest begins to accrue on unpaid 7 amounts; repealing a requirement that a contractor submit an invoice within a certain amount of time in order to receive interest payments; and generally relating 8 9 to the payment practices of the State and local governments for amounts owed under 10procurement contracts.

2 NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER LAW, EACH COUNTY AND MUNICIPALITY 3 SHALL ADOPT THE POLICY ESTABLISHED UNDER § 15–103 OF THE STATE FINANCE 4 AND PROCUREMENT ARTICLE WITH REGARD TO PAYMENT FOR GOODS AND 5 SERVICES PROCURED BY THE COUNTY OR MUNICIPALITY.

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 7 October 1, 2020.
