## A BILL ENTITLED

## 1 AN ACT concerning

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## Health Occupations – Dental Hygienists – Authority to Prescribe and Administer Medication

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing a dental hygienist who complies with certain provisions of 5 this Act to prescribe certain medications; prohibiting a dental hygienist from 6 prescribing certain drugs; authorizing a dental hygienist who complies with certain 7 provisions of this Act to administer medication under a certain standing order and if 8 the dental hygienist includes certain information in a certain manner in the patient's 9 record; requiring a dental hygienist prescribing or administering medication as 10 authorized under certain provisions of this Act to prescribe or administer the 11 medication under certain supervision and in compliance with certain regulations and 12 provisions of law; requiring a dental hygienist to complete certain educational 13 requirements before prescribing or administering medication as authorized under 14 certain provisions of this Act; authorizing the State Board of Dental Examiners to 15 adopt certain regulations; establishing that the Maryland Pharmacy Act does not 16 prohibit a dental hygienist from administering medications under certain provisions of this Act; altering a certain definition; making a conforming change; and generally 17 18 relating to dental hygienists and the authority to prescribe and administer 19 medication.

- 13 (IV) THE DOSAGE OF THE MEDICATION THAT WAS 14 ADMINISTERED.
- 15 (C) A DENTAL HYGIENIST PRESCRIBING OR ADMINISTERING MEDICATION 16 AS AUTHORIZED UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL PRESCRIBE OR ADMINISTER
- 17 MEDICATION:
- 18 (1) UNDER THE GENERAL SUPERVISION OF A LICENSED DENTIST;
- 19 **(2)** IN COMPLIANCE WITH APPLICABLE REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY 20 THE BOARD; AND
- 21 (3) IN COMPLIANCE WITH APPLICABLE PROVISIONS OF TITLE 12 OF 22 THIS ARTICLE AND TITLE 21 OF THE HEALTH GENERAL ARTICLE REGARDING

- 1 (b) "Authorized prescriber" means any licensed dentist, LICENSED DENTAL
  2 HYGIENIST WITH PRESCRIPTIVE AUTHORITY UNDER § 4–206.4 OF THIS ARTICLE,
  3 licensed physician, licensed podiatrist, licensed veterinarian, advanced practice nurse with
  4 prescriptive authority under § 8–508 of this article, or other individual authorized by law
  5 to prescribe prescription or nonprescription drugs or devices.

- 7 (e) (1) This title does not prohibit [a]:
- 8 **(I)** A dentist, physician, or podiatrist from administering a prescription drug or device in the course of treating a patient; **OR**
- 10 (II) A LICENSED DENTAL HYGIENIST FROM ADMINISTERING 11 MEDICATION UNDER § 4–206.4 OF THIS ARTICLE.
- 12 (2) For the purposes of paragraph [(1)] (1)(I) of this subsection, 13 "administering" means the direct introduction of a single dosage of a drug or device at a 14 given time, whether by injection or other means, and whether in liquid, tablet, capsule, or 15 other form.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 17 October 1, 2020.
