FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Green Purchasing Committee to develop on or before a certain date a certain methodology, in consultation with the Department of the Environment and, the Department of Agriculture, the Department of General Services, and other stakeholders, to develop, on or before a certain date, a certain methodology for a unit to estimate greenhouse gas emissions that occur through the life cycle of certain food; requiring the Committee to establish on or before a certain date of certain food and beverages, establish a certain baseline measurement requiring the Committee, in consultation with the Department of the Environment, to establish best practices on or before a certain date, and develop certain strategies and policy recommendations for units to reduce certain greenhouse gas emissions; requiring each unit to give consideration and preference to certain foods and procurement practices; establishing certain goals establishing a certain goal of the Department of General Services General Assembly to reduce overall greenhouse gas emissions according to by a certain reduction schedule percentage by a certain year; requiring each unit to report certain information to the Committee on or before a certain date each year; requiring the Committee to include report certain information in its annual report starting with a certain report to the General

- SECTION 3. 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2020. It shall remain effective for a period of 10 years and 6 months and, at the end of December 31, 2030, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
