## A BILL ENTITLED

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## Health Insurance - In Vitro Fertilization - Revisions

- FOR the purpose of prohibiting certain entities from discriminating on the basis of the marital status of a policyholder or subscriber when providing coverage for certain expenses arising from in vitro fertilization procedures; altering the circumstances under which certain entities are required to provide coverage for certain expenses arising from in vitro fertilization procedures; making conforming changes; providing for the application of this Act; providing for a delayed effective date; and generally relating to health insurance and coverage for in vitro fertilization procedures.

- 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND.
- 16 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## 17 Article – Insurance

- 18 15–810.
- 19 (a) This section applies to:
- 20 (1) insurers and nonprofit health service plans that provide hospital, 21 medical, or surgical benefits to individuals or groups on an expense–incurred basis under
- 22 health insurance policies that are issued or delivered in the State; and
- 23 (2) health maintenance organizations that provide hospital, medical, or 24 surgical benefits to individuals or groups under contracts that are issued or delivered in

1 the State.

- 2 (b) An entity subject to this section that provides coverage for infertility benefits 3 other than in vitro fertilization may not require as a condition of that coverage, for a patient 4 who is married to an individual of the same sex:
- 5 (1) that the patient's spouse's sperm be used in the covered treatments or 6 procedures; or
- 7 (2) that the patient demonstrate infertility exclusively by means of a 8 history of unsuccessful heterosexual intercourse.
- 9 (c) (1) This subsection does not apply to insurers, nonprofit health service 10 plans, and health maintenance organizations that provide hospital, medical, or surgical 11 benefits under health insurance policies or contracts:
- 12 (i) that are issued or delivered to a small employer in the State; and
- 13 (ii) for which the Administration has determined that in vitro fertilization procedures are not essential health benefits, as determined under § 31–116 of this article.
- 16 (2) An entity subject to this section that provides pregnancy—related 17 benefits may not exclude benefits for all outpatient expenses arising from in vitro 18 fertilization procedures performed on a policyholder or subscriber or on the dependent 19 spouse of a policyholder or subscriber.
- 20 (3) The benefits under this subsection shall be provided:
- 21 (i) for insurers and nonprofit health service plans, to the same 22 extent as the benefits provided for other pregnancy—related procedures; and
- 23 (ii) for health maintenance organizations, to the same extent as the 24 benefits provided for other infertility services.
- 25 (4) AN ENTITY PROVIDING COVERAGE UNDER THIS SUBSECTION MAY 26 NOT DISCRIMINATE BASED ON THE MARITAL STATUS OF A POLICYHOLDER OR 27 SUBSCRIBER.

- 13 (e) An entity subject to this section may limit coverage of the benefits for in vitro fertilization required under this section to three in vitro fertilization attempts per live birth, 15 not to exceed a maximum lifetime benefit of \$100,000.
- 16 (f) An entity subject to this section is not responsible for any costs incurred by a policyholder or subscriber or a dependent of a policyholder or subscriber in obtaining donor sperm.
- 19 (g) A denial of coverage for in vitro fertilization benefits required under this section by an entity subject to this section constitutes an adverse decision under Subtitle 10A of this title.
- (h) This section may not be construed to require an entity subject to this section to provide coverage for a treatment or a procedure that would not treat a diagnosed medical condition of a patient.
- 25 (i) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, if the coverage required 26 under this section conflicts with the bona fide religious beliefs and practices of a religious 27 organization, on request of the religious organization, an entity subject to this section shall 28 exclude the coverage otherwise required under this section in a policy or contract with the 29 religious organization.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall apply to all policies, contracts, and health benefit plans issued, delivered, or renewed in the State on or after January 1, 2021.
- 33 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect January 1, 2021.
