- 2 Baltimore City Alcoholic Beverages Distance Restrictions, Extension Fee, 3 and Class D License
- FOR the purpose of altering certain geographic boundaries for a certain limitation to the 4 issuance of a Class B-D-7 license in certain areas; prohibiting the Board of License 5 6 Commissioners for Baltimore City from charging a fee for a temporary license permit 7 extension under certain circumstances; requiring the Board to enforce certain provisions of law; authorizing the Board to waive certain distance restrictions for an 8 9 application for the transfer of a license into a certain area under certain 10 circumstances; prohibiting the Board from issuing a license in or approving the 11 transfer of a license into a certain area under certain circumstances; authorizing certain Class D license holders to serve food, but not alcoholic beverages, during 12 certain hours on Sundays; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages licenses in 13 Baltimore City. 14


