## 2 Health Occupations - Violations of the Maryland Dentistry Act - Penalties and 3 Cease and Desist Orders

- FOR the purpose of authorizing the State Board of Dental Examiners to issue a cease and 4 5 desist order for certain violations; altering certain penalties for certain acts related 6 to the unauthorized practice of dentistry or dental hygiene; authorizing the Board to 7 levy certain civil fines for certain violations under certain circumstances; altering 8 certain penalties for violating certain provisions of law related to dental laboratory 9 work or advertising a dental appliance; providing for the application of certain 10 provisions of this Act; repealing certain provisions of law that specify certain places of imprisonment; providing for a delayed effective date; and generally relating to 11 12 cease and desist orders and penalties for violations of the Maryland Dentistry Act.
