4 FOR the purpose of requiring the State Superintendent of Schools and the Secretary of $\mathbf{5}$ Health each to designate an ombudsman for school-based health centers; requiring 6 certain ombudsmen to serve as a certain point of contact, provide certain technical 7 assistance, and coordinate certain efforts of certain agencies; altering the 8 membership of the Council on Advancement of School-Based Health Centers; 9 requiring the Council to develop certain recommendations for integrating school-based health centers into certain patient-centered models of care; requiring 1011 the Council to review certain data and develop certain recommendations; requiring 12the Maryland Department of Health and the State Department of Education to 13 conduct a certain assessment and report certain findings to the Governor and the 14 General Assembly on or before a certain date; requiring the Maryland Department 15of Health and the State Department of Education to consult with the Council and 16certain stakeholders, develop a certain plan, and report certain findings and 17recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain 18 date; and generally relating to school-based health centers in the State.
