- 3 FOR the purpose of altering the date on which the State shall discontinue certain 4 prescription drug benefits to certain persons if a certain event occurs; altering the 5 date by which the Department of Budget and Management is required to establish 6 certain retiree prescription drug coverage programs; altering the eligibility criteria 7 for participation in the retiree prescription drug coverage programs; altering the list 8 of recipients to whom the Secretary of Budget and Management is required to send 9 a certain notice of changes in a certain prescription drug benefit plan; and generally 10 relating to the State prescription drug benefits for retirees.



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
