BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Transportation Section 21–803 Annotated Code of Maryland (2012 Replacement Volume and 2019 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: **Article – Transportation** 21 - 803.(a) (1) [If] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (3) OF THIS **SUBSECTION, IF**, on the basis of an engineering and traffic investigation, a local authority determines that any maximum speed limit specified in this subtitle is greater or less than reasonable or safe under existing conditions on any part of a highway in its jurisdiction, it
