## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **State Department of Education – Summer Food Service Program – Regulatory**  
3 **Waivers**  
4 **(Summer Meals Waiver Act)**

5 FOR the purpose of requiring the State Department of Education, on behalf of certain  
6 sponsors, to submit to the U.S. Department of Agriculture certain waivers relating  
7 to the federal Summer Food Service Program; requiring the Department to prepare  
8 and submit certain waiver requests in accordance with certain guidelines; requiring  
9 the Department to apply to renew certain waivers under certain circumstances;  
10 making this Act an emergency measure; and generally relating to regulatory waivers  
11 and the federal Summer Food Service Program.

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
18 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 **Article – Education**

20 **7–606.**

21 **(A) IN THIS SECTION, “SFSP” MEANS THE FREE SUMMER FOOD SERVICE**  
22 **PROGRAM ADMINISTERED BY THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE.**

23 **(B) (1) ON OR BEFORE APRIL 1, 2020, AND EACH APRIL 1 THEREAFTER,**

1 IF REQUIRED, THE DEPARTMENT, ON BEHALF OF ALL SFSP SPONSORS IN THE  
2 STATE, SHALL PREPARE AND SUBMIT TO THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE  
3 WAIVER REQUESTS FROM THE REGULATIONS LISTED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS  
4 SUBSECTION REGARDING REQUIREMENTS FOR THE FEDERAL SUMMER FOOD  
5 SERVICE PROGRAM.

6 (2) THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS AUTHORIZE A WAIVER FROM THE  
7 DESCRIBED SFSP REQUIREMENTS:

8 (I) 7 C.F.R. § 210.10(E) AUTHORIZES A WAIVER FROM:

9 1. THE REQUIREMENT THAT A SPONSOR CONDUCT SITE  
10 VISITS DURING THE FIRST WEEK OF SITE OPERATIONS FOR SITES THAT OPERATED  
11 SUCCESSFULLY DURING THE PREVIOUS SUMMER AND HAD NO SERIOUS DEFICIENCY  
12 FINDINGS; AND

13 2. THE REQUIREMENT FOR A FIRST WEEK SITE VISIT BY  
14 A SCHOOL FOOD AUTHORITY SPONSOR, IF THE SPONSOR IS IN GOOD STANDING WITH  
15 THE SFSP;

16 (II) 7 C.F.R. § 210.8(E) AND 7 C.F.R. § 210.10(E) AUTHORIZE A  
17 WAIVER FOR THE EXTENSION OF THE OFFER VERSUS SERVE POLICY TO  
18 NONSCHOOL FOOD AUTHORITY SPONSORS;

19 (III) 7 C.F.R. § 225.16(C) AUTHORIZES A WAIVER OF MEAL  
20 SERVICE TIME REQUIREMENTS; AND

21 (IV) 7 C.F.R. § 225.2 AUTHORIZES A WAIVER TO ALLOW CLOSED  
22 ENROLLED SITES TO QUALIFY BASED ON AREA ELIGIBILITY.

23 (C) A WAIVER REQUEST REQUIRED UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL BE  
24 PREPARED AND SUBMITTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE GUIDELINES PROVIDED BY  
25 THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE FOR COMPLIANCE WITH § 12(L) OF THE  
26 RICHARD B. RUSSELL NATIONAL SCHOOL LUNCH ACT.

27 (D) IF A WAIVER REQUESTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SECTION WAS  
28 GRANTED AND LATER LAPSES OR IS TERMINATED, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL APPLY  
29 TO RENEW THE WAIVER.

30 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency  
31 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has  
32 been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to  
33 each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is  
34 enacted.
