- 23 (C) A WAIVER REQUEST REQUIRED UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL BE
- 24 PREPARED AND SUBMITTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE GUIDELINES PROVIDED BY
- 25 THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE FOR COMPLIANCE WITH § 12(L) OF THE
- 26 RICHARD B. RUSSELL NATIONAL SCHOOL LUNCH ACT.
- 27 (D) IF A WAIVER REQUESTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SECTION WAS
- 28 GRANTED AND LATER LAPSES OR IS TERMINATED, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL APPLY
- 29 TO RENEW THE WAIVER.
- 30 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency
- 31 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has
- been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to
- 33 each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is
- 34 enacted.
