## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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## Weapon Crimes – Assault Long Guns and Copycat Weapons

3 FOR the purpose of altering the definition of "copycat weapon" applicable to certain 4 criminal prohibitions relating to assault weapons; requiring a certain person who  $\mathbf{5}$ lawfully possessed a certain firearm before a certain date to register the firearm with 6 the Department of State Police on or before a certain date; providing that a person 7 who lawfully possessed a certain firearm before a certain date and who voluntarily 8 registers the firearm on or after a certain date and before a certain date is not subject 9 to certain criminal penalties, but is subject to certain registration fees; providing that a person who lawfully possessed a certain firearm before a certain date and who 10 11 registers the firearm on or after a certain date and before a certain date, only after 12being discovered in possession of the firearm by a law enforcement officer, is subject 13 to certain penalties; defining certain terms; and generally relating to weapon crimes.

## SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## Article – Criminal Law

23 (e) "Binary trigger system" means a device that, when installed in or attached to 24 a firearm, fires both when the trigger is pulled and on release of the trigger.

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1 (f) "Bump stock" means a device that, when installed in or attached to a firearm, 2 increases the rate of fire of the firearm by using energy from the recoil of the firearm to 3 generate a reciprocating action that facilitates repeated activation of the trigger.

4 (g) "Burst trigger system" means a device that, when installed in or attached to a 5 firearm, allows the firearm to discharge two or more shots with a single pull of the trigger 6 by altering the trigger reset.

(1) "Copycat weapon" means:

8 (i) a semiautomatic centerfire rifle that can accept a detachable 9 magazine and has any [two] **ONE** of the following:

- 10 1. a folding **OR TELESCOPING** stock;

8 (i) "Detachable magazine" means an ammunition feeding device that can be 9 removed readily from a firearm without requiring disassembly of the firearm action or 10 without the use of a tool, including a bullet or cartridge.

(j) "Flash suppressor" means a device that functions, or is intended to function,
to perceptibly reduce or redirect muzzle flash from the shooter's field of vision.

# 13(K) "FORWARD PISTOL GRIP" MEANS A GRIP THAT ALLOWS FOR14PISTOL-STYLE GRASP FORWARD OF THE TRIGGER.

15 [(k)] (L) "Hellfire trigger" means a device that, when installed in or attached to 16 a firearm, disengages the trigger return spring when the trigger is pulled.

17 [(l)] (M) "Licensed firearms dealer" means a person who holds a dealer's license 18 under Title 5, Subtitle 1 of the Public Safety Article.

19 (N) "PISTOL GRIP THAT PROTRUDES CONSPICUOUSLY BENEATH THE 20 ACTION OF THE WEAPON" MEANS A GRIP THAT ALLOWS FOR A PISTOL–STYLE GRASP 21 IN WHICH THE WEB OF THE TRIGGER HAND BETWEEN THE THUMB AND INDEX 22 FINGER CAN BE PLACED BELOW THE TOP OF THE EXPOSED PORTION OF THE 23 TRIGGER WHILE FIRING.

[(m)] (O) (1) "Rapid fire trigger activator" means any device, including a removable manual or power-driven activating device, constructed so that, when installed in or attached to a firearm:

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- (i) the rate at which the trigger is activated increases; or
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(ii) the rate of fire increases.

(2) "Rapid fire trigger activator" includes a bump stock, trigger crank,
hellfire trigger, binary trigger system, burst trigger system, or a copy or a similar device,
regardless of the producer or manufacturer.

1 (3) "Rapid fire trigger activator" does not include a semiautomatic 2 replacement trigger that improves the performance and functionality over the stock trigger.

## 3 (P) "THUMBHOLE STOCK" MEANS A STOCK WITH A HOLE THAT ALLOWS THE 4 THUMB OF THE TRIGGER HAND TO PENETRATE INTO OR THROUGH THE STOCK 5 WHILE FIRING.

6 [(n)] (Q) "Trigger crank" means a device that, when installed in or attached to a 7 firearm, repeatedly activates the trigger of the firearm through the use of a crank, a lever, 8 or any other part that is turned in a circular motion.

10 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, a person may not:

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- (1) transport an assault weapon into the State; or

12 (2) possess, sell, offer to sell, transfer, purchase, or receive an assault 13 weapon.

(b) (1) A person who lawfully possessed an assault pistol before June 1, 1994,
and who registered the assault pistol with the Secretary of State Police before August 1,
1994, may:

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(i) continue to possess and transport the assault pistol; or

18 (ii) while carrying a court order requiring the surrender of the 19 assault pistol, transport the assault pistol directly to a law enforcement unit, barracks, or 20 station, a State or local law enforcement agency, or a federally licensed firearms dealer, as 21 applicable, if the person has notified a law enforcement unit, barracks, or station that the 22 person is transporting the assault pistol in accordance with a court order and the assault 23 pistol is unloaded.

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 10 October 1, 2020.
