A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Vehicle Laws - Driving in Right-Hand Lanes

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the driver of a vehicle traveling slower than the general speed 4 of traffic on certain highways to drive the vehicle in the right-hand lanes under $\mathbf{5}$ certain circumstances; requiring the Motor Vehicle Administration to include certain 6 information in the State's driver education curriculum; requiring the State Highway 7 Administration to inform drivers of certain requirements by posting certain signage 8 and providing certain notice in a certain manner; requiring the Motor Vehicle 9 Administration and the State Highway Administration to provide a certain report to certain committees of the General Assembly; and generally relating to requirements 1011 to drive in the right-hand lanes of a roadway.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Transportation

20 21-301.

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(b) (1) On every roadway, except while overtaking and passing another vehicle going in the same direction or when preparing for a lawful left turn, any vehicle going 10 miles per hour or more below the applicable maximum speed limit or, if any existing conditions reasonably require a speed below that of the applicable maximum, at less than the normal speed of traffic under these conditions, shall be driven in the right-hand lane

3 (2) (I) ON A ROADWAY THAT IS DIVIDED INTO TWO OR MORE

5 DRIVER OF A VEHICLE TRAVELING SLOWER THAN THE GENERAL SPEED OF TRAFFIC,
6 IF PRACTICABLE AS DETERMINED BY THE DRIVER, SHALL DRIVE IN THE
7 RIGHT-HAND LANE OR LANES.

8 (II) THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL INCLUDE THE REQUIREMENT 9 UNDER SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF THIS PARAGRAPH IN THE STATE'S DRIVER 10 EDUCATION CURRICULUM.

11(III) THE STATE HIGHWAY ADMINISTRATION SHALL INFORM12DRIVERS OF THE REQUIREMENT UNDER SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF THIS PARAGRAPH:

131.BY PLACING AND MAINTAINING SIGNS AT REGULAR14INTERVALS ON APPROPRIATE HIGHWAYS; AND

152.THROUGH THE DYNAMIC MESSAGE SIGN SYSTEM16LOCATED THROUGHOUT THE STATE.

17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before December 1, 18 2022, the Motor Vehicle Administration and the State Highway Administration shall report 19 jointly to the Senate Judicial Proceedings Committee and the House Environment and 20 Transportation Committee, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, 21 on the efforts made to provide driver education and notice throughout the State required 22 under this Act.

23 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 24 October 1, 2020.

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
