## 1 AN ACT concerning

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## Minority Participation in the Alcoholic Beverages Industry – Study

FOR the purpose of requiring the Governor's Office of Small, Minority, and Women 3 Business Affairs to conduct a certain study concerning the alcoholic beverages 4 5 industry in the State; providing for the matters to be included in the study; requiring 6 the Governors' Office of Small, Minority, and Women Business Affairs to conduct the 7 study in consultation and cooperation with certain agencies and interests; requiring the Office of the Attorney General and the Department of Transportation to provide 8 9 staff for the study; requiring the Governor's Office of Small, Minority, and Women 10 Business Affairs to report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and the 11 General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this 12 Act; and generally relating to the alcoholic beverages industry and minority 13 communities.

14 Preamble

WHEREAS, Since the end of Prohibition in 1933, the alcoholic beverages industry has been dominated by a small number of companies, particularly in the area of distilled spirits; and

WHEREAS, Although minorities, particularly African Americans, constitute a considerable portion of the consumers of alcoholic beverages, they are underrepresented in the alcoholic beverages industry as manufacturers, distributors, and retailers; and

WHEREAS, Because of the sensitivity to community values and concerns that belonging to a minority community brings to economic activity in the community, meaningful participation by minorities in the alcoholic beverages industry, particularly in the distribution and retail sectors, may provide a substantial benefit to minority communities and to the State at large; and

WHEREAS, Under federal precedent, state—encouraged participation in an industry through a set—aside or preference system requires demonstration of a disparity in the industry based on historical discrimination; now, therefore,

- 9 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 10 That:
- 11 (a) The Governor's Office of Small, Minority, and Women Business Affairs shall conduct a study of the participation of minority—owned businesses in the alcoholic beverages industry in the State.
- 14 (b) The study shall include:
- 15 (1) historical and current levels of participation by minority–owned 16 businesses in the manufacturing, distributing, and retail sales tiers of the alcoholic 17 beverages industry in the State;
- 18 (2) historical and current levels of market activity in retail sales of 19 alcoholic beverages in the State, especially in areas with high concentrations of minority 20 population;
- 21 (3) a demonstration of historical and current disparities in the levels of 22 participation of minorities in the manufacturing, distributing, and retail sales tiers of the 23 alcoholic beverages industry in the State through a commissioned and completed disparity 24 study; and
- 25 (4) consideration and development of legally supportable mechanisms to 26 increase the participation of minorities in each tier of the alcoholic beverages industry in 27 the State by set—aside, by preference, by economic development assistance, or by other 28 appropriate mechanisms.
- 29 (c) The Office shall conduct the study in consultation and cooperation with:
- 30 (1) the Office of the Attorney General;
- 31 (2) the Office of the Comptroller;
- 32 (3) the Executive Director of the Field Enforcement Division of the Alcohol and Tobacco Commission;
