A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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2 Transportation – Western Maryland MARC Rail Extension – Study

- FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Transportation to conduct a study on extending Maryland Area Regional Commuter (MARC) rail service to western Maryland; requiring the Department to study and make recommendations regarding certain matters; requiring the Department to report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to conducting a study on extending MARC rail service to western Maryland.
- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 11 That:
- 12 (a) The Department of Transportation shall conduct a study and develop 13 recommendations on the feasibility, including the cost, of extending MARC rail service to 14 western Maryland.
 - (b) In conducting the study, the Department of Transportation shall:

It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of September 30, 2022, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

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
