- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring that a certain individual who has completed training in an 4 approved alcohol awareness program be present on a licensed premises at certain 5 times; authorizing a trained individual to be absent from the licensed premises for 6 up to a certain time for certain reasons; requiring the local licensing board to require 7 the license holder to keep a log book documenting certain details of the absence in a 8 certain form; altering certain penalties for violations related to alcohol awareness program training; requiring the Alcohol and Tobacco Commission to report to the 9 10 General Assembly on certain matters on or before a certain date; and generally 11 relating to alcohol awareness programs.


