Maryland Transit Administration – Disabled Reduced Fare Program – Opioid Treatment Program Patients

FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Transit Administration to make available to 4 5 opioid treatment programs certain transit passes that are for use by certain patients 6 and may be issued in a certain manner; requiring the transit passes to be made 7 available at a certain price; requiring the Administration to adopt certain 8 regulations; requiring the Administration to submit a certain report beginning on or 9 before a certain date, and on or before a certain date each year thereafter; and generally relating to the Maryland Transit Administration and transit passes for 10 11 patients at opioid treatment programs.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 18 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## 19 Article – Transportation

- 21 (A) (1) THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL MAKE AVAILABLE TO OPIOID 22 TREATMENT PROGRAMS MONTHLY TRANSIT PASSES THAT:
- (I) ARE FOR USE BY PATIENTS OF OPIOID TREATMENT PROGRAMS WHO QUALIFY FOR THE ADMINISTRATION'S DISABLED REDUCED FARE

## 1 PROGRAM; AND

- 2 (II) MAY BE ISSUED TO PATIENTS ON SITE AT OPIOID 3 TREATMENT PROGRAMS BY OPIOID TREATMENT PROGRAM STAFF.
- 4 (2) THE TRANSIT PASSES ISSUED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS
  5 SUBSECTION SHALL BE MADE AVAILABLE AT A REDUCED PRICE THAT REFLECTS THE
  6 PRICE OF A MONTHLY PASS ISSUED UNDER THE DISABLED REDUCED FARE
  7 PROGRAM AS OF OCTOBER 1, 2020, LESS ANY COST SAVINGS TO THE
  8 ADMINISTRATION THAT RESULT FROM HAVING PARTICIPATING OPIOID TREATMENT
  9 PROGRAMS ISSUING TRANSIT PASSES DIRECTLY TO PATIENTS.
- 10 (B) THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO ESTABLISH THE
  11 PROCESS BY WHICH PARTICIPATING OPIOID TREATMENT PROGRAMS MAY ISSUE
  12 TRANSIT PASSES UNDER THIS SECTION.
- 13 (C) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1, 2021, AND ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1
  14 EACH YEAR THEREAFTER, THE ADMINISTRATION, IN CONSULTATION WITH
  15 PARTICIPATING OPIOID TREATMENT PROGRAM PROVIDERS, SHALL SUBMIT A
  16 REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1257 OF THE STATE
  17 GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON THE STATUS OF THE
  18 IMPLEMENTATION OF THE REQUIREMENTS UNDER THIS SECTION.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 20 1, 2020.
