- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

- (b) "Board" means the Maryland Tourism Development Board.

7 8	(2) spend money of the Fund to plan, advertise, promote, assist, and develop the tourism and travel industries in the State; and
9 10 11	(3) provide grants to destination marketing organizations AND TO NONGOVERNMENTAL TOURISM ORGANIZATIONS for the purpose of attracting visitors to the State of not less than:
12	(i) \$2,350,000 in total for fiscal year 2011; and
13 14	(ii) \$2,500,000 in total for fiscal year 2012 and for each fiscal year thereafter.
15 16	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2020.
