12 (a) On or after July 1, 2020, a person may not sell or offer for sale in the State an 13 expanded polystyrene food service product.

14 (b) On or after July 1, 2020, a food service business or school may not sell or 15 provide food or beverages in an expanded polystyrene food service product.

16 (c) This section does not prohibit a person from storing a food service product for 17 later distribution outside the State.

18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June1, 2020.
