- FOR the purpose of prohibiting the delegation of certain responsibilities of guardianship of a disabled person to a certain staff person if the delegation would result in the staff
- 5 person being responsible for more than a certain number of guardianships; and

- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND.

14 Article – Estates and Trusts

- 16 (a) Persons are entitled to appointment as guardian of the person according to
- 17 the following priorities:
- 18 (10) (i) For adults less than 65 years old, the director of the local
- 19 department of social services or, for adults 65 years old or older, the Secretary of Aging or
- 20 the director of the area agency on aging, except in those cases where the department of
- 21 social services has been appointed guardian of the person before age 65; and
- 22 (ii) On appointment as guardian under item (i) of this item, directors
- 23 of local departments of social services, directors of area agencies on aging, and the Secretary
- 24 of Aging may delegate responsibilities of guardianship to staff persons whose names and

- 2 RESULT IN A STAFF PERSON BEING RESPONSIBLE FOR THE GUARDIANSHIP OF MORE

- 4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 5 October 1, 2020.
