BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments, The Public Local Laws of Baltimore City Section 16–1(6), (7), and (8) Article 4 – Public Local Laws of Maryland (1979 Edition and 1997 Supplement, and 2000 Supplement, as amended) BY adding to The Public Local Laws of Baltimore City Section 16-2A Article 4 – Public Local Laws of Maryland (1979 Edition and 1997 Supplement, and 2000 Supplement, as amended) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND.



- The following words and phrases as used in this subtitle shall have or include the following meanings.
- 3 (6) "Members of the department" shall mean and include all persons and 4 personnel employed by the department, whether civilian employees or police officers.
  - (7) "Police officers" shall mean all those members of the department having and exercising the powers of police officers, as provided in this subtitle, and shall specifically include the Police Commissioner of Baltimore City, all deputy police commissioners, and such other ranks or positions which the Commissioner may determine require experience as a police officer as a prerequisite.
- 10 (8) "Civilian employees" shall mean all members of the department other 11 than police officers.

- (A) SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, THE MAYOR AND CITY
  COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE CITY MAY REQUIRE MEMBERS OF THE COMMAND STAFF
  OF THE DEPARTMENT, AT THE RANK OF CAPTAIN OR ABOVE, TO RESIDE IN
  BALTIMORE CITY.
- 17 (B) A LOCAL LAW, ORDINANCE, OR POLICY ENACTED OR ADOPTED BY THE
  18 MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE CITY UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL
  19 INCLUDE PROVISIONS FOR GRANTING A WAIVER OR EXEMPTION FROM THE LOCAL
  20 LAW, ORDINANCE, OR POLICY FOR A MEMBER OF THE COMMAND STAFF WHO IS
  21 MARRIED TO AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS EMPLOYED BY A GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY THAT
  22 HAS SIMILAR EMPLOYEE RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That a local law, ordinance, or policy enacted or adopted by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore City in accordance with this Act shall be construed to apply only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have any effect on or application to the continued employment of any individual employed by the Police Department of Baltimore City before the effective date of the local law, ordinance, or policy.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 30 October 1, 2020.
