A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Maryland Intrastate Emergency Management Assistance Compact

3 FOR the purpose of renaming the Maryland Emergency Management Assistance Compact 4 to be the Maryland Intrastate Emergency Management Assistance Compact; $\mathbf{5}$ altering the purpose of the Compact; requiring a certain official to designate more 6 than one authorized representative for a certain purpose; altering the information 7 that must be provided by a certain written request; repealing the authority of a 8 certain official to advise the Maryland Emergency Management Agency of certain 9 requests and provide copies of certain requests; altering the circumstances under 10 which certain provisions of law take effect and continue in effect; altering certain 11 definitions; making stylistic changes; and generally relating to the Maryland 12Intrastate Emergency Management Assistance Compact.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 19 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

5 (d) (1) "Emergency responder" means an individual who is sent or directed by 6 a party jurisdiction in response to a request for assistance by another party jurisdiction.

- (2) "Emergency responder" includes a:

8 (i) career or volunteer firefighter [within this State] OF A FIRE,
9 RESCUE, OR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES ENTITY;

10 (ii) career or volunteer emergency medical services provider, as 11 defined in § 13–516 of the Education Article, within this State;

(iii) career or volunteer rescue squad member [within this State] OF
 A FIRE, RESCUE, OR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES ENTITY;

14 (iv) county **OR MUNICIPAL** employee who is performing an 15 emergency support function described in § [14-803(2)(b)(5)(ii)] **14-803(2)(B)(5)(I)** of this 16 subtitle; and

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- (v) law enforcement officer as defined in § 3–101 of this article.

18 (e) "Jurisdictions" means the 23 counties within Maryland, Baltimore City, the 19 City of Annapolis, and Ocean City.

20 (F) "PARTY JURISDICTION" MEANS A JURISDICTION THAT ENACTS THE 21 COMPACT IN A FORM SUBSTANTIALLY SIMILAR TO THE COMPACT SET FORTH IN 22 THIS SUBTITLE.

4 (1) Article 1. Purpose.

5 (a) (1) The purpose of this Compact is to provide for EMERGENCY 6 MANAGEMENT mutual assistance between the jurisdictions entering into this Compact [in 7 managing an emergency].

8 (2) This Compact also shall provide for mutual cooperation in 9 [emergency-related] EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT-RELATED exercises, testing, or other 10 training activities [using equipment or personnel simulating performance of any aspect of 11 the giving and receiving of aid by party jurisdictions during emergencies].

- (2) Article 2. Requests for Assistance.

13 (b)The senior elected official of each jurisdiction shall designate (1)14an authorized [representative] **REPRESENTATIVES.** The AN authorized 15representative of a party jurisdiction may request assistance [of] **FROM** another party 16 jurisdiction by contacting [the] AN authorized representative of that jurisdiction.

- 17 (2) The provisions of this Compact shall apply only to requests for 18 assistance made by and to authorized representatives.
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(3) Requests may be verbal or in writing.

20 (4) If verbal, the request shall be confirmed in writing at the earliest 21 possible date, but no later than 10 calendar days following the verbal request.

1 (II) THEREAFTER, THIS COMPACT SHALL BECOME 2 EFFECTIVE AS TO ANY OTHER JURISDICTION UPON ITS ENACTMENT BY THAT 3 JURISDICTION.

4 (3) Any party jurisdiction may withdraw from this Compact by 5 enacting a repeal of the same but no such withdrawal shall take effect until 30 days after 6 the senior elected official of the withdrawing jurisdiction has given notice in writing of such 7 withdrawal to the senior elected officials of all party jurisdictions.

8 (4) Withdrawal from the Compact shall not relieve the withdrawing 9 jurisdiction from obligations assumed under Article 4 or Article 6 of this Compact prior to 10 the effective date of withdrawal.

11 (5) Authenticated copies of this Compact and of such supplementary 12 agreements as may be entered into shall at the time of their approval be retained by each 13 party jurisdiction and with the Maryland Emergency Management Agency.

14 (8) Article 8. Validity.

15 (h) (1) This Compact shall be construed to effectuate the purposes 16 stated in Article 1 hereof.

17 (2) If any part or provision of this Compact or the application thereof 18 to any person or circumstance is held invalid for any reason in a court of competent 19 jurisdiction, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or any other application of this 20 Compact which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and for this 21 purpose the provisions of this Compact are declared severable.

22 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 23 October 1, 2020.
