# Motor Vehicle Administration – Authority to Suspend Registration for Violations Recorded by Traffic Control Signal Monitoring Systems – Repeal

  registration of a motor vehicle if the owner or driver of the motor vehicle fails to pay
  the penalty assessed for a certain violation recorded by a traffic control signal
