1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Anne Arundel County – Alcoholic Beverages – Board of License Commissioners**
3 **Staff and Compensation**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Board of License Commissioners for Anne Arundel
5 County to employ a full-time executive director whose salary is fixed by the Board
6 within a certain county classified pay grade; requiring, instead of authorizing, the
7 Board to employ a full-time administrator whose salary is fixed by the Board within
8 a certain county classified pay grade; requiring the Board to employ two full-time
9 secretaries whose salaries are fixed by the Board within a certain county classified
10 pay grade; and generally relating to the Board of License Commissioners for Anne
11 Arundel County.

22 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

1 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

2 **Article – Alcoholic Beverages**

3 11–102.

4 This title applies only in Anne Arundel County.

5 11–204.

6 (b) (1) The Board may employ:

7 (i) [no more than two full–time administrators whose annual
8 salaries shall be fixed by the Board as in a general county classified salary schedule, within
9 pay grade 16;

10 (ii)] inspectors, subject to § 11–206 of this subtitle; and

11 [(iii)] (II) clerical and other assistants as are necessary.

12 (2) The Board shall employ:

13 (i) a **FULL–TIME EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR WHOSE ANNUAL**
14 **SALARY SHALL BE FIXED BY THE BOARD AS IN A GENERAL COUNTY CLASSIFIED**
15 **SALARY SCHEDULE, WITHIN PAY GRADE 17;**

16 (II) **A FULL–TIME ADMINISTRATOR WHOSE ANNUAL SALARY**
17 **SHALL BE FIXED BY THE BOARD AS IN A GENERAL COUNTY CLASSIFIED SALARY**
18 **SCHEDULE, WITHIN PAY GRADE 16;**

19 (III) **TWO** full–time [secretary] **SECRETARIES** whose annual [salary]
20 **SALARIES** shall be fixed by the Board as in a general county classified salary schedule,
21 within pay grade 13; and

22 [(ii)] (IV) an attorney at an annual salary of \$60,000.

23 (3) (i) The Board may hire an attorney on a contractual basis to perform
24 work that the attorney employed by the Board is unable to perform because of a conflict of
25 interest.

26 (ii) The Board may spend not more than \$30,000 each year to hire a
27 contractual attorney under subparagraph (i) of this paragraph.

28 (4) Except as otherwise provided in this subtitle, the Board may set the
29 compensation of the employees.

1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
2 1, 2020.
