# Health Occupations - Social Workers - Scope of Practice, Supervision, and Application Decision Appeal Process

FOR the purpose of altering the definition of "practice social work" for the purposes of the 4  $\mathbf{5}$ Maryland Social Workers Act to include counseling for alcohol and drug use and 6 addictive behaviors and to clarify that it includes, for certain individuals, the 7 treatment of biopsychosocial conditions under the supervision of a licensed social worker-clinical; providing that certain provisions of law may not be construed to 8 9 prohibit certain licensees from applying or qualifying to obtain approval by the State 10 Board of Social Work Examiners to engage in independent practice under certain 11 circumstances; requiring the Board, under certain circumstances, to approve certain 12 licensees approved to engage in independent practice to provide supervision; 13authorizing an applicant for a certain license to appeal the Board's rejection of an 14 application to take a certain licensure examination by submitting certain 15documentation to the Board in a certain manner; making conforming changes; and generally relating to the licensure and practice of social workers. 16
