1 AN ACT concerning

State Highway Administration – Highway Work Permits – Pedestrian Access (Pedestrian Access Act of 2020)

4 FOR the purpose of requiring a person that obtains a highway work permit from the State $\mathbf{5}$ Highway Administration to maintain pedestrian access at certain work sites for 6 work to be performed in certain areas to maintain a safe alternative pedestrian path 7 at the work site; requiring the Administration to adopt certain regulations, subject 8 to certain standards and requirements, governing pedestrian access in areas subject 9 to a highway work permit; requiring the Administration to compile, publish, and make available an inventory of certain best practices for the maintenance of 10 11 pedestrian access in areas where construction or maintenance work is performed in State highway rights-of-way; defining certain terms; and generally relating to 12 13pedestrian access in areas subject to a highway work permit.
