Miscellaneous" Annotated Code of Maryland (2018 Replacement Volume and 2019 Supplement) (As enacted by Section 1 of this Act)

13	(3) that is not used for submersion of the human body.
14 15 16	(b) The governing body of a county may adopt and enforce rules and regulations to govern the sanitary condition of splash pads and any sanitary feature connected to a splash pad.
17 18 19	(C) THE STATE, THE GOVERNING BODY OF A COUNTY, OR A MUNICIPALITY MAY NOT REQUIRE A LIFEGUARD TO BE PRESENT AT A SPLASH PAD WHEN THE SPLASH PAD IS IN USE.
