Harford County - Alcoholic Beverages - License Holder Requirements

- 3 FOR the purpose of repealing certain residency and other requirements for an applicant for 4 an alcoholic beverages license in Harford County; requiring that an applicant operate 5 and serve as the manager or supervisor of the business conducted on the licensed 6 premises, be responsible for the operation of the license, and be physically present 7 on the licensed premises daily for a substantial amount of time; and generally 8 relating to alcoholic beverages licenses in Harford County.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 24
- 25 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Alcoholic Beverages

- 2 This title applies only in Harford County.
- 3 [22–1402.
- 4 (a) (1) To be issued a license for the applicant's individual use, the applicant 5 shall be a resident of the county for at least 1 year before filing the application.
- 6 (2) The license holder is required to remain a resident of the county for as 7 long as the license is in effect.
- 8 (b) An applicant under this section is not required to be a registered voter.]

- TO BE ISSUED A LICENSE FOR THE APPLICANT'S INDIVIDUAL USE, THE APPLICANT SHALL:
- 12 (1) OPERATE AND SERVE AS THE MANAGER OR SUPERVISOR OF THE 13 BUSINESS CONDUCTED ON THE LICENSED PREMISES;
- 14 (2) BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE OPERATION OF THE LICENSE; AND
- 15 (3) BE PHYSICALLY PRESENT ON THE LICENSED PREMISES DAILY FOR 16 A SUBSTANTIAL AMOUNT OF TIME.
- 17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2020.
