## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Harford County – Alcoholic Beverages – Class MT (Movie Theater) License**

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Board of License Commissioners for Harford County to  
4 grant up to a certain number of Class MT (movie theater) licenses to the same person;  
5 increasing the fee for a certain license; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages  
6 in Harford County.

7 BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments,

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

18 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 **Article – Alcoholic Beverages**

20 22–102.

21 This title applies only in Harford County.

22 22–1005.1.

23 (a) There is a Class MT (movie theater) beer, wine, and liquor license.

1 (b) (1) The Board may issue the license for use by the owner of a movie theater.

2 (2) To be eligible for the license, the owner of a movie theater is required  
3 to provide documentation to the Board that the owner has made an investment of at least  
4 \$250,000 in the movie theater.

5 **(3) THE BOARD MAY ISSUE NOT MORE THAN FIVE CLASS MT**  
6 **LICENSES TO THE SAME PERSON.**

7 (c) (1) The license holder may sell beer, wine, and liquor for on-premises  
8 consumption from 4 p.m. to midnight on the days that the movie theater is open.

9 (2) Beer, wine, and liquor may be sold only:

10 (i) in single-serve containers; and

11 (ii) from a counter separate from a counter serving candy, popcorn,  
12 and nonalcoholic beverages.

13 (3) A movie theater for which the license is issued:

14 (i) is subject to the alcohol awareness training requirements under  
15 § 4-505 of this article; and

16 (ii) shall offer for sale food other than candy and popcorn.

17 (d) The annual license fee is [~~\$500~~] **\$1,000**.

18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July  
19 1, 2020.
