- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

21	This title applies only in Harford County.
22	22–1005.1.

23 (a) There is a Class MT (movie theater) beer, wine, and liquor license.

1 (b) (1)The Board may issue the license for use by the owner of a movie theater. $\mathbf{2}$ (2)To be eligible for the license, the owner of a movie theater is required 3 to provide documentation to the Board that the owner has made an investment of at least \$250,000 in the movie theater. 4 $\mathbf{5}$ (3) THE BOARD MAY ISSUE NOT MORE THAN FIVE CLASS MT 6 LICENSES TO THE SAME PERSON. 7(c) (1)The license holder may sell beer, wine, and liquor for on-premises 8 consumption from 4 p.m. to midnight on the days that the movie theater is open. 9 (2)Beer, wine, and liquor may be sold only: 10 (i) in single-serve containers; and 11 (ii) from a counter separate from a counter serving candy, popcorn, 12and nonalcoholic beverages. A movie theater for which the license is issued: 13 (3)14is subject to the alcohol awareness training requirements under (i) 4–505 of this article; and 15shall offer for sale food other than candy and popcorn. 16(ii) The annual license fee is **[**\$500**] \$1,000**. (d) 17SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 18 191, 2020.
