A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Public Schools – Flexible Instructional Days – Policy Requirements

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing a county board of education to develop a policy for public 4 schools in the county to use a certain number of flexible instructional days during $\mathbf{5}$ the school year; providing for the contents of a certain policy; authorizing a county 6 board to apply to the State Board of Education for approval to implement a certain 7 policy; requiring the State Board to adopt certain guidelines and a certain model 8 policy and to approve or deny a certain application; requiring a flexible instructional 9 day to count toward a certain requirement; defining a certain term; and generally relating to flexible instructional days for public primary and secondary schools. 10

2 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "FLEXIBLE INSTRUCTIONAL DAY" MEANS A DAY ON 3 WHICH A PUBLIC SCHOOL PROVIDES REMOTE ACADEMIC INSTRUCTION TO 4 STUDENTS BECAUSE THE SCHOOL IS PREVENTED FROM OPENING DUE TO:

- 5 (1) NATURAL DISASTER;
- 6 (2) CIVIL DISASTER; OR
- 7 (3) SEVERE WEATHER CONDITIONS.

8 (B) (1) A COUNTY BOARD MAY DEVELOP A POLICY FOR PUBLIC SCHOOLS 9 IN THE COUNTY TO USE UP TO 5 FLEXIBLE INSTRUCTIONAL DAYS DURING A SCHOOL 10 YEAR.

11 (2) A FLEXIBLE INSTRUCTIONAL DAY POLICY DEVELOPED BY A 12 COUNTY BOARD UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION MAY:

13(I) REQUIRE ALL PUBLIC SCHOOLS IN THE COUNTY TO14INITIATE FLEXIBLE INSTRUCTIONAL DAYS AT THE DIRECTION OF THE COUNTY15BOARD; OR

16 (II) AUTHORIZE PUBLIC SCHOOLS IN THE COUNTY TO 17 INDIVIDUALLY INITIATE FLEXIBLE INSTRUCTIONAL DAYS AS DETERMINED BY THE 18 SCHOOL.

19(3) A FLEXIBLE INSTRUCTIONAL DAY POLICY DEVELOPED UNDER20PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION SHALL INCLUDE:

(I) PROCEDURES FOR INITIATING A FLEXIBLE INSTRUCTIONAL
 DAY, INCLUDING MODEL CLASS INSTRUCTION DURING A FLEXIBLE INSTRUCTIONAL
 DAY;

24(II)THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF SCHOOL STAFF AND STUDENTS25DURING THE FLEXIBLE INSTRUCTIONAL DAY;

26 (III) PROCEDURES FOR IDENTIFYING STUDENT PARTICIPATION 27 FOR THE PURPOSE OF DETERMINING ATTENDANCE;

28(IV) WHETHER THE USE OF TECHNOLOGY WILL BE REQUIRED TO29IMPLEMENT FLEXIBLE INSTRUCTIONAL DAYS, INCLUDING INFORMATION

1 REGARDING ACCOMMODATIONS FOR STUDENTS AND SCHOOL STAFF WITHOUT 2 ACCESS TO TECHNOLOGY OR INTERNET ACCESS AT HOME;

3 (V) THE METHOD FOR PROVIDING NOTICE TO STUDENTS, 4 PARENTS, AND SCHOOL EMPLOYEES REGARDING THE DETAILS OF THE POLICY; AND

5 (VI) ANY OTHER INFORMATION REQUIRED BY THE STATE 6 BOARD.

(C) (1) A COUNTY BOARD MAY APPLY TO THE STATE BOARD FOR
APPROVAL TO IMPLEMENT DURING A SCHOOL YEAR A FLEXIBLE INSTRUCTIONAL
DAY POLICY DEVELOPED IN ACCORDANCE WITH SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION.

10 (2) A COUNTY BOARD MAY NOT IMPLEMENT A FLEXIBLE 11 INSTRUCTIONAL DAY POLICY UNLESS APPROVED BY THE STATE BOARD.

12 (D) THE STATE BOARD SHALL:

(1) ADOPT GUIDELINES AND A MODEL POLICY TO ASSIST A COUNTY
 BOARD WITH THE DEVELOPMENT OF A POLICY UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS
 SECTION, INCLUDING MODEL CLASS INSTRUCTION DURING A FLEXIBLE
 INSTRUCTIONAL DAY; AND

17 (2) APPROVE OR DENY A COUNTY BOARD'S APPLICATION FOR A 18 FLEXIBLE INSTRUCTIONAL DAY POLICY.

19 **(E)** A FLEXIBLE INSTRUCTIONAL DAY SHALL COUNT TOWARD THE MINIMUM 20 SCHOOL DAY REQUIREMENT UNDER § 7–103 OF THIS SUBTITLE.
