A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Natural Resources - SAV Protection Zones and Hydraulic Clam Dredges (Aquatic Habitat Protection Act)

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Secretary of Natural Resources to adopt regulations to $\mathbf{5}$ define and govern the use of hydraulic clam dredges, subject to certain requirements; 6 increasing the frequency with which the Department of Natural Resources must 7 update the delineations of submerged aquatic vegetation (SAV) protection zones; 8 requiring the updated delineations to include areas where submerged aquatic 9 vegetation has been mapped by certain surveys in certain years; altering the conditions on which a previously delineated SAV protection zone may be opened to 10 11 the use of certain gear; authorizing, rather than requiring, the Department to utilize 12certain buoys or landmarks to mark SAV protection zones; requiring the Department 13 to provide certain maps on the Department's website; prohibiting a person from using certain gear within a certain distance of an SAV protection zone; requiring the 1415Department to conduct a certain study and submit a certain report to certain 16 committees of the General Assembly on or before a certain date; making stylistic 17changes; and generally relating to SAV protection zones and hydraulic clam dredges.

1 brought up to boat level by means of an escalator. $\mathbf{2}$ (2) "Hydraulic clam dredge" includes the vessel on which the dredge is 3 carried. 4 4 - 1006.1. $\mathbf{5}$ (a) (1)In this section the following words have the meanings indicated. 6 (2)"Aerial survey" means the annual aerial survey compiled by the 7 Virginia Institute of Marine Sciences for the annual Bay-wide Submerged Aquatic 8 Vegetation Mapping Program. 9 "SAV protection zone" means an area delineated by the Department for (3)the protection from uprooting and the restoration of submerged aquatic vegetation. 10 11 (b)[In 2004 and every 3 years thereafter] EACH YEAR, the Department (1)shall update the delineations of SAV protection zones [that were completed in 2001]. 1213The updated delineations shall include areas where submerged aquatic (2)14vegetation has been mapped by aerial surveys during at least 1 of the previous [3] 5 years. 15Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, a previously (c)(1)delineated SAV protection zone may be opened to the use of the gear set forth in subsection 16 17(f) of this section during an update if: 18 Aerial surveys have not shown any submerged aquatic (i) 19vegetation in the area during the past [3] 5 years; or 20Aerial surveys have shown the density of submerged aquatic (ii) 21vegetation in that area to be less than 10% during each of the past 6 years. 22The areas in the vicinity of Smith Island, South Marsh Island, and (2)23Bloodsworth Island that were closed to hydraulic clam dredging in the 1999 delineation 24shall be closed to the gear set forth in subsection (f) of this section and may not be reopened. 25(d) To the extent possible, the Department shall adjust SAV protection (1)26zones so that delineations are geographically manageable, utilizing straight lines and 27existing points of reference. 28To the extent possible, an adjustment made in accordance with (2)(i) 29paragraph (1) of this subsection shall result in no net loss or gain of protected area. 30 (ii) To the extent possible, to prevent the net loss or gain of protected 31area resulting from an adjustment made in accordance with paragraph (1) of this 32subsection, the adjustment may:
