### A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

## Public Health – Prescription Drug Affordability Board and Fund

3 FOR the purpose of repealing certain provisions of law requiring the Prescription Drug 4 Affordability Board to determine a certain funding source on or before a certain date,  $\mathbf{5}$ consider using certain methods in making a certain determination, and report to 6 certain committees of the General Assembly on a certain recommendation; requiring 7 the Board to assess and collect a certain fee from certain persons in a certain manner; 8 requiring the Board to calculate a certain fee in a certain manner; requiring certain 9 entities to pay a certain fee on or before a certain date each year; requiring the Board 10 to allow certain persons to make certain payments; providing that certain fees may 11 be subject to a certain interest penalty; prohibiting a certain amount of fees collected 12within a certain period of time from exceeding a certain amount; requiring the Board 13to pay certain fees into the Prescription Drug Affordability Fund; establishing the 14Fund as a special, nonlapsing fund; specifying the purpose of the Fund; requiring the 15Board to administer the Fund; requiring the State Treasurer to hold the Fund and 16the Comptroller to account for the Fund: requiring any interest earnings of the Fund 17to be credited to the Fund; specifying the contents of the Fund; specifying the purpose 18 for which the Fund may be used; providing for the investment of money in and 19expenditures from the Fund; requiring the Fund to be subject to a certain audit; 20adding special funds to the types of funds that are required to be used to establish 21 the Board; requiring the Board to repay certain funds from the Fund to the Maryland 22Health Care Commission under certain circumstances and over a certain period of 23time: exempting the Fund from a certain provision of law requiring interest earnings 24on State money to accrue to the General Fund of the State; providing for the 25construction of certain provisions of this Act; defining a certain term; making 26conforming changes; and generally relating to the Prescription Drug Affordability 27Board and Fund.

3 (a) (2) (i) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, and unless 4 inconsistent with a federal law, grant agreement, or other federal requirement or with the 5 terms of a gift or settlement agreement, net interest on all State money allocated by the 6 State Treasurer under this section to special funds or accounts, and otherwise entitled to 7 receive interest earnings, as accounted for by the Comptroller, shall accrue to the General 8 Fund of the State.

9 (ii) The provisions of subparagraph (i) of this paragraph do not apply 10 to the following funds:
