11 (2) KNOWINGLY PROVIDE INFORMATION TO THE **FEDERAL** 12GOVERNMENT OR ANOTHER STATE FOR THE CREATION OR MAINTENANCE OF A 13**REGISTRY FOR THE PURPOSE OF DISCRIMINATING AGAINST INDIVIDUALS ON THE** 14BASIS OF RELIGION, RACE, GENDER, SEXUAL ORIENTATION, IMMIGRATION STATUS, 15OR NATIONAL OR ETHNIC ORIGIN.

16 THE STATE MAY NOT REIMBURSE ANY EXPENDITURE TO THE **(B)** (1) EXTENT THAT THE EXPENDITURE VIOLATES SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION. 17

18 (2) THE STATE IS NOT OBLIGATED TO APPROPRIATE MONEY TO PAY 19 AN EXPENDITURE THAT VIOLATES SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION.

20**(C)** EACH EMPLOYEE OR OFFICER OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT WHO MAKES 21AN EXPENDITURE OR RECEIVES STATE FUNDS THAT VIOLATE SUBSECTION (A) OF 22THIS SECTION IS SUBJECT TO DISCIPLINARY ACTION, INCLUDING TERMINATION, 23UNDER THE APPLICABLE DISCIPLINARY AND GRIEVANCE PROCEDURES IN TITLES 11 AND 12 OF THE STATE PERSONNEL AND PENSIONS ARTICLE. 24

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Attorney General, in 25consultation with the appropriate stakeholders, shall develop guidelines to assist public 2627schools, hospitals, and courthouses to draft policies that limit civil immigration 28enforcement activities on their premises in order to ensure these facilities remain safe and 29accessible to all, regardless of immigration status.

30 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That public schools, hospitals, and courthouses may establish and publish policies that limit immigration enforcement on their 3132premises to the fullest extent possible consistent with federal and State law based on the guidelines developed by the Attorney General. 33

34 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, in order to ensure that

eligible individuals are not deterred from seeking services or engaging with State agencies, all State agencies shall review their confidentiality policies and identify any changes necessary to ensure that information collected from individuals is limited to that which is necessary to perform agency duties, does not include inquiries into immigration status unless required by federal law or necessary to make a determination of eligibility, and is not used or disclosed for any other purpose. Any necessary changes to those policies shall be made as expeditiously as possible, consistent with agency or department procedures.

8 SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That if any provision of this Act or 9 the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid for any reason in a 10 court of competent jurisdiction, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or any other 11 application of this Act that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, 12 and for this purpose the provisions of this Act are declared severable.

13 SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect14 October 1, 2020.
